Michael B. Curry, who is Bishop of the Episcopal Church wrote: "Lent has two remarkable bookends." On one side, he said, is Ash Wednesday (March 6, 2019) when we are reminded that we're dust but God loves us even in our dustiness. The other side, Easter, (April 21st) is when we celebrate God's love and the power it has to transform US and the world.

Lent, which is the 40 days before Easter (don't count Sundays.) It's a time, much like Advent, that we can be deliberate for ourselves and encourage each other to take some time for what it means to live a Christian life. What does that mean?

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind.

Luke 10:27, Deuteronomy 6:5

As we follow in Jesus' footsteps THIS Lent, let's take thoughtful time to consider the ultimate goal – to live out God's love for the world. Regretfully, there isn't anything written, anywhere, that says this journey will be easy.

There are going to be times that we struggle and even stumble, but we're not alone. Because we're all God's children we're connected and share in this: that we realize God's plan. Jesus came to show us how!

I'll be emailing a daily Lenten devotional (one I've had in a file for a while) and also posting it on the Pikes Peak UMC Facebook page. Perhaps, as a discipline, you could share it with others in your contact list. In addition, our series of messages from Ash Wednesday to Easter is called "With All Your Heart." This might just be the invitation you need to welcome others into worship with us through Lent 2019 and beyond.

"Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow"

Thomas Ken, author of "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow", was born in England in 1637, educated at Winchester College, then Oxford and was ordained as a Minister of God's Word at age 25. His beautiful hymn, written in 1692, is well known today as the "Doxology" that we sing each Sunday after the offering is received.

Bishop Ken sang his song of praise each day as a morning, evening and midnight hymn. It was a song of praise used spontaneously in times of great joy or triumph as shown by the following story. In Lancashire, England, during the cotton famine of the 1600's, which had reduced unemployed workers to destitution, the first wagon load of cotton finally arrived. After releasing the horse, the workers dragged the wagon throughout the streets singing with tears of joy, "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow".

As we sing this age-old praise on Sunday mornings, we too catch a glimpse of the many blessings that God gives to us.




