That's churches AND individuals. As we come to Pentecost Sunday and then into the season of Pentecost, I'm going to encourage you (again) to take part in the Bible studies we're offering at PPUMC. You could attend before worship on Sunday (current study: **Rediscovering our Spiritual Gifts, Building Up the Body of Christ Through the Gifts of the Spirit)** or for a light lunch and study on Thursdays (current study: Life of Elijah.)

Both studies point out opportunities and strengths for the growth of our faith and our abilities to encourage OTHERS to come to know the love of God and Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. Huh! Could that encouragement be "just the thing" to attract others to join us to praise and worship God at PPUMC? I'm praying about you and who will join us for study and a life in Christ.

The liturgical color of the season of Pentecost is **GREEN**...the color of growth and life. It's a long season. It'll last until the end of November! And we can use that time to hone our abilities, gifts, and skills to grow the Kingdom to the Glory of God. Amen? AMEN!

UMW Dorothy's Circle Pikes Peak United Methodist Church May

The May 2nd meeting began at 1:30 pm, with the reciting of the UMW pledge which was read in unison by six of our ladies, including guest speaker Megan Slifer from LaPuente Mission.

As we welcomed our speaker Megan for her fourth year with us, we were impressed with the work that LaPuente has accomplished this last year. Some of the exciting news covered the Adelante program renamed the **Family Resource Center** that now serves the entire San Luis Valley! LaPuente provides Emergency relief for those in poverty or homelessness; a separate program for off-grid homesteaders half of whom are veterans; food and educational programs for children; 15 food pantries who provide food to 4,558 families and several thrift stores in the Valley; 6,083 lbs of produce were gleaned and distributed by volunteers and 18,229 lbs of other foods were collected through food drives.

Dorothy Circle collected 6 large bags of clothing, a large bag of shoes, 150 lbs of rice and 32 hygiene bags were sewn, filled and sent back with Megen plus a \$100 speaker's fee and extra cash for her gas and travel. (LaPuente is a 6 to 7 hour round trip). We have supported them for over 20 years with our prayers, love and support! Thank you to all who contribute to this worthy cause! May God bless you.

In lieu of the Spiritual growth reading, President Brown gave a short overview of the history of our Circle originally known as the Women's Society of World Service.

Last month's minutes were read and approved.

The Treasurer's financial report was presented along with copies of last month's finances given to the President and Secretary, thanks to Jessie's careful accounting!

We appreciate all the greeting cards written and sent to the congregation, by Susie G.

We closed the meeting by repeating the UMW prayer together. Everyone asked LaVada for the recipe for her most excellent pumpkin cake that she served as our refreshment! Thank you LaVada!



"God Leads His Dear Children Along"

Both words and music were written by Reverend George A. Young. (1855-1935, approximately)

Reverend Young was a preacher during the late 1800's who, after years of struggle and poverty, managed to build a small house for his wife and family. Unfortunately, while out of town tending to his flock, their home was burned to the ground by a group of disgruntled men who disagreed with the Reverend's preaching.

Soon after the fire, in 1903 Young wrote this hymn as a testimony to God's continuing care, as one verse says, "Some through great sorrow, but God gives a song, in the night season and all the day long, God leads his dear children along."

It is not known when Reverend Young died, but in 1942, his widow was found living in a very poor County Poor Farm, where she glowed with God's love! She is quoted that God sent her there to live since so many residents did not know her Jesus and she was delighted to introduce them to her Lord and Savior!
