

Compassion International Sunday

On Sunday, July 14, we were blessed to hear our guest speaker, Kennedy Krezi, who was a Compassion International (CI) sponsored child from age 7 to 19. He was given his first shoes at age nine, attended a government school, was medically saved from a blinding disease, and later was able to attend college where he received two degrees. He now lives in Colorado with his wife of six years and has two children. Kennedy and his wife also sponsor a CI child.

Kennedy told of his early life, sang and played his guitar for us during the offering, and answered questions about adopting a child in CI. Ruth Richey who was in charge of this event, assembled four pictures/stories out of a dozen candidates for our church to sponsor. During Fellowship time, Archie Wilson turned the four pictures upside down, and with several church members there, Archie prayed over the pictures. Then, Ruth randomly picked the one that she felt God would have us adopt.

Family and friends, we have a boy! Our new son/brother through Christ is named Bereket Getachew and he lives in Ethiopia with his mom. He is beautiful. He has pretty brown eyes, a cross on a string around his neck and looks a little anxious in his picture. He is considered a PRIORITY WAITING CHILD by the CI. It is no wonder that God has led him to us and us to him.

"O God, Our Help in Ages Past"

"O God, Our Help in Ages Past," was written in 1719 by Reverend Isaac Watts, who was ordained and began serving at his first church as Assistant Minister of the Independent Church, in London at age 24. In 1712, Isaac contracted a life-threatening fever that left him practically an invalid. He was invited to stay at the home of Sir Thomas Abney minister of the Independent Church until he was well.

However, Isaac never fully recovered and spent the rest of his 36 years living there, writing hymns and preaching whenever his health permitted. During his lifetime, the Reverend, Isaac Watts wrote over 800 hymns and poems with many of them still in use today. We are familiar with another of his hymns, "Joy to the World," which is still considered the most popular and most published Christmas hymn of the last century.
