
# Lamplighter

#### Pikes Peak Dorothy Circle Minutes August 1st, 2019

The August 1<sup>st</sup> meeting began at 1:30 pm, with the reciting of the UMW pledge which was read by ten of our ladies, and guest speaker Sam Rush Walton from Ronald McDonald House.

For several years Sam has been our representative and this year they are excited about the completion of their new location east of the city, at 4223 Royal Pine Drive. The new building has 25,000 square feet with 20 guest rooms and 20 bathrooms. Everything is larger and better able to accommodate the increasing need of a safe home-setting for families with children in hospital care at the new East Side Hospital location. The 10 million dollars required for this project came from private and corporate donations, with all the landscaping donated by one local landscape company. We sent eight bags of donations back with Sam to help stock the kitchen and personal care areas of Ronald McDonald House, along with a speaker's fee of \$100.

The minutes from <u>June</u> were approved. (The July 4<sup>th</sup> Holiday fell on our meeting date.) The Treasurer's financial report was presented along with copies of June's finances and handed to the President and Secretary. Thank you Jessie.

In New Business: Jessie brought up the idea that our UMW should discuss a budget to present to those requesting a memorial/funeral service. We will discuss this further.

Gretchen asked for prayers for the Church's upcoming Legacy, 115<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration on the 8<sup>th</sup> of September. A large crowd is expected to attend.

We closed the meeting by repeating the UMW prayer together and enjoyed a German Chocolate cake made by Denise Sherwood. Thank you, Denise, it was delicious.

"O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing"

Charles Wesley wrote this song in 1739, to celebrate the first anniversary of his conversion into a living faith in Jesus Christ. This was to honor God as the words from the song that we now know as, *O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing*, were originally the 7<sup>th</sup> stanza of the song. The driving force of his newfound trust in Christ led Charles into a ministry whereby Charles asked to be locked up in Newgate Prison with prisoners who were to be executed the following day. Charles would spend that night comforting and witnessing to them with through prayer and song.

This song spoke to so many hearts that it was listed in brother John Wesley's book, "Collection of Hymns" in 1780 as the first hymn of that book, and after 239 years, it is still well known and often sung in most Methodist Churches.


