

"Gloria in Excelsis Deo"

Written by famed composer, Johann Sebastian Bach in 1733, to celebrate the Birth of Christ, *Gloria in Excelsis Deo* is Latin for "Glory to God in the Highest" and is Bach's sole surviving composition written in Latin.

Johann was born into a musical family on March 31, 1685, his father appointed as the City Musician of Eisenach, Germany. Several brothers had already settled into musical positions by the time Johann was orphaned at age 10, so he went to live with his musically gifted, eldest brother for the next five years while learning to fine tune his own musical compositions. Although Johann wrote over 200 Cantatas, once you have stood and listened to the Gloria in Excelsis Deo, you cannot forget the magnificent ending that has virtually remained unchanged from its original version.

In the last decades of his life Johann reworked many of his earlier compositions and died in 1750 at the age of 65, from complications following eye surgery.






K & C GIGGLERS PPUMC's Crafters


