

February 2018



February brings several different observed celebrations – like Ground Hog Day, President's Day, and Valentine's Day. Many of us complain of the busy-ness of our lives and how many commitments we have on the calendar. So, as Lent begins this month, let's take a look at how we spend and use our time and whether those uses of our time are well-spent...or what God would like us to be doing with our time at all.

The Season of Lent, a preparatory time culminating the night before Easter Morning, begins on Ash Wednesday...which is also Valentine's Day this year; February 14. Isn't it interesting how God has used the calendar for His purpose this time? The day we celebrate love (with dinners and candy and flowers) is, in 2018, the day we "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The 40 days of Lent are a time for stepping back a bit to examine ourselves, to remember the real reason that Jesus was born (to save us from our sins) and enables us to confront our less-than-perfection lives.

Then, through the Lenten season we'll how we need to slow down and see what God is doing. I'll be using a series of messages called "Do You Have the Time?" YOU'RE INVITED to be intentional with others in your Family of Faith at PPUMC.

And, I hope that you'll do some *outreach* of your own to invite others to join us, too, as we discuss these topic ideas:

- ~Being intentional to have a time with God.~Checking to be sure our activities are for the *right* reasons.
 - ~Giving additional time to God (and fasting from something else that takes our time.)
 - ~ Being sure that our social media/online time is affectively spreading the message of love.
 - ~Being aware of the "timer count down."

~Slowing down.

As we go through Lent, I pray that we'll see how God is using us, <u>yep US</u>, for God's purpose. We've been called to be disciples of Jesus Christ...for the transformation of the world – AND GOD is prepared to use us *just as we are; right where we are* to bring God's message of hope and love to those feeling lost on their particular faith journey.

We aren't alone – we're part of a community of faith.



I find it interesting that Jesus called his disciples from the fishing boats and from a tax booth (and other unseemly places) into a motley group who had to learn to work together...and serve together...and love others (starting among themselves.) That plan seemed to work! And I believe that model works well in our Family of Faith, too.

Right where we are: let's begin Lent by addressing real life circumstances (and people) and learn how faith in Christ is relevant to everyday life and how having a faith community can make all the difference.

"Tell Me the Stories of Jesus"

William H. Parker, the author of "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus", was a devoted Sunday School teacher. He was born in March of 1845, in the little town of New Basford in Nottingham, England, and he died 84 years later without ever having moved away from his birthplace. His great love for God and devotion to Jesus Christ led him to find his calling through teaching Sunday School children the many stories of Jesus, and often his youthful audience would beg for "one more, please sir," and if time permitted, there would indeed be "one more" wonderful story of Jesus!

These stories were always Biblically based but Mr. Parker made them easier to understand for the younger children when he told the story as if it were happening right there in front of the youngsters.

One Sunday afternoon in 1885, Mr. Parker felt moved to write a poem that would help his students remember some of the stories about Jesus and later on, in 1903, his friend Frederick A. Challinor, set that poem to music. And that is how the song was born that has been in Methodist Hymnals for decades, "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus" was listed under Hymns for Children in over 137 song books of that time!


