It was the end of the day when I parked my police van in front of the station. As I gathered up my equipment, my K-9 partner Jake was barking and I saw a little boy staring in at me. "Is that a dog you got back there?" he asked. "It sure is," I replied. Puzzled, the boy looked at me and then towards the back of the van. Finally he asked, "What'd he do?"

We now have a "Dog Ministry" food bucket. In the kitchen, to the right of the stove, there is a white bucket labeled, Dog Food; dry kibble for any hungry canine who comes for sanctuary. Another Year |s Dawning

The author of this song, Miss Frances Ridley Havergal, (1836 – 1879), began life in England as the youngest child of a Minister of the Church of England. By age four she was reading and memorizing the Bible and spent her life serving God through her music and poetry. With her father being a Minister, her brother being a priest and church organist, it wasn't surprising that Frances become a poet and hymnist.

The first verse of this 1874, New Year's Hymn tells us of her dedication to God: "Another year is dawning, dear Father let it be. In working or in waiting, another year with Thee. Another year of progress, another year of praise. Another year of proving Thy presence all the days."

In that same year Frances wrote another hymn entitled, "Take My Life and Let it Be". Both lovely hymns, however, "Take My Life and Let it Be" has become even more popular with the passing of time then the New Year's song of, "Another Year is Dawning." All in all, Frances wrote hundreds of hymns, poems and meditations.

As a lasting memorial to her life, Havergal College, a private girls' school in Toronto, Ontario Canada, (established in 1894) was named for Frances R. Havergal. In 2012, Havergal's elementary school was awarded first place among Toronto schools, receiving a "perfect score of 10." In 2015, Havergal's secondary school came in second among all of Ontario's 749 secondary schools. This has been a lasting and fitting tribute to a most remarkable woman of God. The writer of this lovely song also wrote "Take My Life and Let it Be".


