UMW Dorothy's Circle Pikes Peak United Methodist Church June

The June 2nd meeting of the United Methodist Women's Dorothy Circle began at 1:34 pm with the reading of the Purpose of the United Methodist with ten women present.

Our Spiritual Growth Leader, Beulah Shaw, brought us a reading from the Daily Bread Devotional entitled, "Called by Name". A teacher recalls how he called his students each by name and how that relates to our Lord calling us by name. The scripture reference is from John 10: 11 where the Good Shepherd calls His sheep by name and knows their deepest needs. Thank you Beulah!

We welcomed our speaker, Andrea Thompson with Urban Peak of Colorado Springs; a youth outreach organization dedicated to helping the homeless youth of our region with housing, shelter, addictions and health care. These youth range in age from 15 to 24 years and many are supported by the Urban Peak's several programs including the Street Outreach program where three teams of backpack workers find young people on the streets and provide on-the-spot assistance. Food, water, basic medical needs and compassion are some of the things that the teams carry to offer the young people living on the streets of Colorado Springs. What an amazing program where only three teams were able to help 445 youth last year! Andrea also told us that Urban Peak is the ONLY place in the Springs for homeless kids and that they work closely with the police and other organizations in town to provide for these young people! Right now in Colorado Springs, approximately 1,400 to 1,500 youth are experiencing homelessness! Dorothy Circle gave Andrea a speaker's fee as well as supplying them with 7 bags of necessities.

The Secretary encouraged our membership to read the Church newsletter where the June minutes are published and if there are any corrections to please let her know.

Jessie Cooper our Treasurer, brought us up to date on the UMW account as well as the Community Service account and provided copies of the Bank balances to President Brown and Secretary Arnold. Jessie also noted that our monetary donations are not keeping up with our speaker fees and President Brown hopes that the few speakers from our Circle will help to offset this imbalance. Thank you Jessie for keeping us updated!

June birthday cards and other greeting cards are being sent out by Beulah Shaw. We received a thank you card from the Ronald McDonald house for last month's donations and Grace Cook received another letter from Red Bird Mission thanking us for the education labels that she sends them each month.

The hostess line-up has changed a bit for the year with Grace Cook providing refreshments in July and Ruth Ann Reed providing refreshments for September. Thank you to both these ladies for offering their assistance!

Those who can help, please meet at 12 noon on July 7th to fill our LaPuente Bags before our regular meeting begins at 1:30.

Ethel Pierson graciously hosted our June meeting and supplied our refreshments of a delicious torte! Thank you Ethel for this delightful dessert, most of us have never had a torte before!

We ended our meeting at 3:05 by reading the UMW prayer together.

Jesus Loves Me, the favorite song most recognized by children, was written by Anna Bartlett Warner in 1860, as the country was preparing for Civil War. Anna, living close to the Military Academy of West Point, taught Sunday Bible studies to the cadets, fearing many of them would die in the upcoming war and they needed to know Jesus as quickly as possible!

Although best known as a children's hymn, **Jesus Loves Me** didn't begin as a song. Instead, it was part of a fictional novel written by Anna in 1860. The words were part of a poem recited by the book's main character Mr. Lindon, to a small boy who lay dying. Upon hearing this, the little child was then comforted knowing that 'Jesus loves me.'

Jesus Loves Me, brought comfort to the war torn country, as well as to generations that followed, even to another war and to a President yet to be. In 1943, in the Solomon Islands, John F. Kennedy's PT 109 had been sunk and the survivors, hoping to be rescued, were singing, "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know". It was this song that led two Solomon Island natives to the stranded marines and eventually to their rescue!

Although most of her novel did not make it through the Civil War, Anna's poem did, set to music and now is one of the most recognizable songs in history!


