UMW Dorothy's Circle

Pikes Peak United Methodist Church

The March 5th, 2015 meeting of the United Methodist Women's Dorothy Circle began with a reading of the Purpose of the United Methodist Women.

This month's program of personal memories of WWII was presented by our own Millie Ware and Beulah Shaw. Jessie Cooper brought her mother's hand-made, green wool suit from 1947 and asked Gretchen to model it for the group. The lovely suit consisted of a fitted jacket, matching A-line skirt, short sleeved, peplum lace blouse, with a matching hat and veil. What a visual way to transition into World War II! Thank you Jessie for sharing this part of your mother's history with us!

Beulah began with six points of interest: 1941 – December 7, Pearl Harbor; December 8, US declared war on Japan; December 11, Hitler declares War on US; January 1, 1942 twenty-six nations (the UN) signed a Declaration of War; and President Roosevelt has 125 Aircraft and 3,500 guns manufactured for the war effort; 1945 War Is Over!

Millie recalled life in Benton Harbor, Michigan, where her family raised rabbits for eating and to share with neighbors! She remembers the rationing of meat, sugar and flour, butter, eggs, shoes, and other articles of clothing, gas and tires. Everyone had to go before a ration board to apply for tires and script was issued instead of cash to buy things.

Benton Harbor's industry collected neighborhood iron fences to melt down for battleship and PT boat building while Italian and German POW's worked in town or the outlying fruit orchards during the day and were placed in prison at night. When troop trains pulled into town, the VFW women would serve the troops cookies, fruit and cheese and give each young man a New Testament Bible.

Beulah, residing in Watertown, Connecticut at the same time, recalled how her sister's husband who parachuted down in France to find a woman with two daughters waiting. The women had shovels and extra men's clothing; shovels to bury his parachute and clothes, while he quickly changed into a Frenchman's clothes. They hid him until he was able to walk out of France and ended up in British territory at the Rock of Gilbrator. After eight months as MIA, (missing in action) he was sent home and returned to work as a military radio instructor where he was killed in a crash. This tragic event, so long ago, still brought tears to Beulah's eyes.

Watertown had Air Wardens who patrolled the coastal area and checked homes and businesses to be sure they complied with the black-out rules; all lights turned off before dark, shades drawn down and curfew's enforced. If these rules were ignored, Beulah's husband Herb an Air Warden himself, could have arrested the culprit.

What a rich and vivid history of WWII these blessed women gave us! Thank you Millie, and Beulah for your time and effort in sharing your stories with us!

Treasurer Jessie Cooper, designed an accounting form that shows our UMW and Community Service Balances each month! Thank you Jessie for your diligent work in keeping our accounts straight!

Other news for our membership was that Hal Smith sent a thank you card for the Valentine's bag of goodies and his 97th birthday card. Deb Pemberton has not been well and will receive a get-well card, as will Melissa Stallings who has surgery this month. We wish all our community of faith good health as we go into spring and summer, especially Pastor's Dea and Gene.

The March meeting was hosted and refreshments provided by Gretchen Arnold. Next month, on Thursday, April 2, at 1:30 pm Millie Ware will host our meeting with Sam Rush-Walton from the Ronald McDonald House.

Melt our hearts with compassion for others. Mold our lives with a willingness to serve Fill us with and let us listen to the guidance of Your Holy Spirit.





Renewal of Creation

Jesus said he came so that people could live life to the fullest. What would Jesus think if he lived today with oil pipeline breaks spilling into rivers, trains derailing with catastrophic consequences, devastating hurricanes, tornadoes and blizzards, unprecedented earthquake swarms and groundwater contamination near shale oil fracking sites? How would Jesus teach if he lived today?

Remember the Tree of Life? - Growing at the center of the Garden of Eden in Genesis, and growing in the middle of the New Jerusalem in Revelation? The TREE OF LIFE - offering fruit that is good to eat, and leaves for the healing of the nations.

What does it mean to live life to the fullest as disciples of Jesus Christ? It means learning to live our lives in ways that contribute to the fullness of life for all people. Founder of Methodism, John Wesley, called this HOLINESS. He spoke of personal holiness and social holiness. It was the idea that if people grew in their knowledge and love of Jesus (personal holiness) we would experience abundance of life and we would be moved to help others experience it (social holiness). In Wesley's time, Methodists visited people in prisons and cared for orphans. They organized labor collectives, and started schools and hospitals in poor neighborhoods. Wesley believed that our faith would lead us into the world in ways that helped others enjoy life to the fullest.

For four years, as lay and clergy members gather for Annual Conference, we are cultivating God's Tree of Life, focusing on four life-affirming themes. In June 2015, we will gather under the broad, graceful branches of God's promise of abundant life with a focus on the theme: *Renewal of Creation*. Renewal of Creation builds on the themes of the past two years.
