from the Pastor's pen

Greetings, Family of Faith of Pikes Peak UMC! With the change of our calendar pages comes the change of Pastor Leslie Wood's departure and my arrival as your new pastor. I have been praying about you and the ministries that go forth from the church building we call our faith home. My husband, a retired UM pastor, Gene, and I are looking forward to serving and working among you in the days and years ahead. It is exciting to anticipate what God has in store for all of us.

As we start the New Year we are also in the new *church* season of Epiphany. The Scripture readings we will encounter, for the Sundays after the Epiphany, show, in dramatic ways how people came to understand who Jesus was, through his baptism, the calling of his disciples *and* through a bodacious healing in his hometown synagogue!

The word *epiphany* means *appearance* or *manifestation*. Some of us would use words such as "*eureka*" or "*aha*" like when that light bulb of understanding comes on. We'll have plenty of "aha" moments together as we journey through the church year using Year B of the lectionary readings. In 2015 the gospel readings will come from the book of Mark.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the "big four", one of the synoptic gospels and probably the earliest written (at least that's what my professors at Perkins School of Theology keep telling me.) Interestingly, as we read through the Gospel of Mark we have those epiphanies of details that aren't in the Gospels of Matthew or Luke. The writer of Mark's gospel recounts what Jesus did in vivid style and the pace of the narrative will keep us almost breathless. Doesn't THAT sound like an exciting way to journey with Jesus in 2015? The Gospel of Mark has – and will allow us to have our own - "aha moments" as we come to understand who Jesus was as Son of God **and** Son of Man and why He had come to live among us.

To continue the ministry of Jesus we established Human Relations Day as a Special Sunday that calls all of our churches to participate in helping all God's children to realize their potential.
