Christ is risen! Now what?

We are currently in Eastertide – the weeks between remembering the Sunday of Jesus' resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The liturgical color is white. We're still singing Easterlike hymns. *But, what is this time for?*


Social News
