UMW Dorothy's Circle

Pikes Peak United Methodist Church

The October 1st, 2015 meeting of the United Methodist Women's Dorothy Circle began at 1:30 pm with the reading of the Purpose of the United Methodist Women. There were ten members present with four guests, including our speaker, Jennifer Polk from the Marion House Soup Kitchen.

Beulah Shaw presented our Spiritual Growth reading called, "Let's Pray." Based on Luke 19:10, "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost." This reading reminds us that Jesus is a friend to sinners and a true friend looks for you when you are lost! So, we know Jesus draws near to us to get us back to our Father, God! Thank you Beulah.

We welcomed our speaker, Jennifer Polk, from the Marion House Soup Kitchen which is affiliated with Catholic Charities of Central Colorado. The soup kitchen has, for the last 26 years, served free meals to anyone who needed a meal in Colorado Springs. Today they serve over 209,000 meals a year, seven days a week with only 50 volunteers each day who prepare and serve these meals! The recipients of the 600 to 750 meals a day are 50% homeless people and the other 50% have some kind of housing with friends or in apartments and are considered the "working poor". Unfortunately, their income does not provide enough to keep them fed and housed. To keep up with this demand, one million dollars in food is donated each year by local businesses and groups.

The Marion House has expanded into other programs that often begin with the soup kitchen. The soup kitchen provides a "gateway" into the Family Day Center which has developed programs for children and families, Crisis assistance, and a separate dining room for families with little children. An entire menu with "kid friendly food" has emerged and families are able to sit at individual tables in a more private setting in a separate room. This makes each family unit more comfortable and reduces the stress of eating in a dining hall. We appreciated Jennifer's time and presentation with a round of applause; she was given a donation from our speaker's fund and several items to take back with her. Last month's minutes were read and approved by the group.

Treasurer Jessie Cooper prepared a balance sheet for the bank account and gave a copy to President Brown and Secretary Arnold for the month of September after reporting the balances of the UMW and Community Service accounts to the membership. Thank you Jessie for all your work, it's appreciated!

Beulah sent cards to those who have birthdays in October as well as those who are ill or recovering from surgery. We also appreciate Virginia Van Der Wege's work in taking photos for the Church directory and Ruth Ann Reed's hard work in putting the whole directory all together!

Grace Cook brought a thank you letter from Red Bird Mission for the education labels she collects for them and for the subscription of Biblical Archeology Magazine that she donates to them. Thank you Grace!

Our meeting ended with a reading of the UMW prayer at 2:56 pm.

Our October refreshments, provided by Jessie Cooper, were delicious fall inspired items. Pumpkin cake, frozen yogurt along with fresh fruit was enjoyed by all. Thank you Jessie! Thanks also to all the helpful members who step up and assist with refreshment time!

November Dorothy Circle meeting will be held at the Church on November 5th at 1:30 for a special crafting social. Using the time that we would normally have a speaker, we will be doing crafts that are completely supplied and organized by some of our members!

It will be a good time to chat since we don't have much time at our regular meetings to just socialize with each other. So if you would like to, please drop and make yourself at home with the girls and with the craft projects, it is always free. You will be welcome and have fun getting to know these great Godly women.

At the November meeting we will also discuss the upcoming December, Christmas meeting. Hope to see you making one or more of the beautiful crafts that will be available at the November meeting!
