UMW Dorothy's Circle Pikes Peak United Methodist Church

The June 5th meeting of Dorothy Circle began at 1:30 with reading the purpose of the United Methodist Women.

A most interesting program was given by speaker Zuleika Munoz from Urban Peak, a local organization that provides services in Colorado Springs for runaway and homeless youth ages 15 to 20 years old. Unfortunately, children in Foster Care are considered adults at age 18 and are released from the Foster Care system. Many of these children are not prepared for a life on their own and over 75% of them end up at Urban Peak. They arrive, as displaced youth, seeking a place to sleep; food and help on how to get a job and a place to live. Each youth gets paired with a case manager who provides direction in all aspects of life essential to becoming a self-sufficient adult. Urban Peak works closely with the CSPD "Hot Team" to identify homeless and at risk youth in the downtown area to get these young people off the street and into a safe environment. Last year Urban Peak reached 387 youth through their street outreach program alone! In 2004, Urban Peak moved from its temporary location at the Marian House Soup Kitchen to their current location at 423 E. Cucharras Street.

Colorado Springs is fortunate to have such an organization to help with homeless youth and to guide them as they become able to care for themselves, get jobs and find housing. Dorothy Circle gave them a kind donation for speaking to us along with three large cases of bottled water.

Next month we will host the LaPuente Mission speaker on July 3rd at 1:30 pm at the Church. This is a worthwhile Mission that Dorothy Circle has supported for many years and as usual we will be filling migrant worker bags with personal care essentials. Small size items such as you would find in a hotel are best, as they fit easily into the bags. Needed are shampoo, small combs, hand sanitizer, bath towels and washcloths, sun visors, chapstick with sunscreen, and small lotion. There will be a box set up in the entry way of the church, labeled LaPuente Mission with a list of items needed if you would like to donate to this worthy cause.

Even if you can't donate, please plan on attending the presentation which will begin our meeting. The business part of the meeting will begin after the talk and you do not need to stay for this part. We hope to see you there! Millie Ware will be our hostess this month.

Dorothy Circle is the Pikes Peak United Methodist Women's group, a group of women devoted to serving God in our community. All women are invited to join us for Christian growth and fellowship.

Dorothy Circle wishes to thank Dick Bush and Herb Shaw for the one hundred plus-hours they worked putting in the drinking fountain in Gamber Hall. It is so nice to get a cool drink without having to find a cup and get a drink in the kitchen. Thank you both!!
