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UMW Dorothy's Circle Pikes Peak United Methodist Church

The August meeting of the United Methodist Women's Dorothy Circle began at 1:30 pm with eleven people present to hear an update from Urban Turzi, our long-time contact and today's speaker from One Nation Walking Mission.

Urban began by telling us he had recently joined a group of Utes at a Sacred Tree ceremony in the Black Forest. Teens from many Ute tribes were there to learn about their heritage with these trees which historically guided the People to various sites such as water, lodging or religious places.

Urban then updated us on activities over the last year. One Nation Walking now has a new warehouse located in the old Alexander Film Company that comes complete with an administrative office and all for the same cost as their original site! There is a women's gathering called the Women's Talking Circle which meets twice a month to discuss native women's abuse which is three times more prevalent among Indians as it is for the rest of the country.

There is a new food sustainability program which has just begun which gives a family 12 laying hens and teaches them the care and maintenance of the flock. A family in Kiowa County is the first to receive 12 chickens and they hope to raise more chickens to share. Another new program starting in 2015 will raise hydroponic vegetables using fish hatchery waters.

Along with these new programs, there are Pow-Wow's, lectures, concerts and a film festival designed to help the people at One Nation Walking run their program. Urban told us it takes \$11,000 a month to keep them up and going. LaVada will share information from them on how we might be able to help. Urban left us with a saying, "When the chips are down, the buffalo is empty". Dorothy Circle gave Urban donations of household items, clothing, personal items and a monetary speaker's contribution as well. Our thanks goes to our two guests Joe Brown and Jerry Hartley, who carried the items out to Urban's truck. Next, we enjoyed Beulah's uplifting spiritual reading from "Songs of a Seeking Heart" entitled, **I wasn't always old, you know**, with thoughts based on John 15:5 about how to remain fruitful throughout all seasons of life. A cute passage from her reading regarded a white-haired lady's T-shirt which read, "I'm not 80, I'm 18 with 62 years of experience." Thank you Beulah.

Jessie read the Treasurer's report and kept up on the bank account! Thank you Jessie.

Thanks to Grace Cook who donated flowers and cards for our UMW gathering.

Dorothy Circle is the United Methodist Women's group for Pikes Peak UMC. We serve God through our service to others, upholding in prayer those in need and keeping Christ first in our lives!

On the first day of school Emily noticed that a girl at a desk near hers did not have the supplies she would need as a student. When Emily went home that day, she told her mother about the situation. They both decided that they should go shopping and purchase whatever the poor child would need. Arriving a bit early at school the next day, Emily put all the supplies needed on the child's desk along with a note that read "Surprise, Emily". Emily may not have realized it, but she was being a good steward. Stewardship involves giving of one's self and of one's resources for the needs we see around us.

A certain pastor arrived at his church one morning and saw a 95-year-old man standing on a small ladder. He had a tool in his hand he was using to trim a hedge that had grown too large. The pastor suggested that the old fellow leave that job for someone younger. The old guy ignored the advice and continued whacking away at the bush. You and I might gasp at the story but we cannot deny that he was exercising stewardship as best he could. It turned out that he finished the job without getting hurt at all.

In the fourth chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he wrote: "*This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy,*" What a challenge! "It is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy." I ask myself, "Am I a good steward who is always trustworthy?"
