

When the Roll is Called Up Yonder

Reverend James Milton Black was inspired to write this most beloved, early Methodist song, when in 1893, at a youth gathering in his Sunday School class, one student didn't respond to the attendance call. After learning the girl was sick with pneumonia and because her family was too poor to afford medical care, he called a doctor to threat her. On his way home, Reverend Black thought about the implication of someone not responding to the roll call of Heaven and upon his arrival at home, he was inspired to write the music and the words to, "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder." It is recorded that Rev. Black said. "I spoke of what a sad thing it would be when our names are called from the Lamb's Book of Life, if one of us should be absent."

Several days later this song was sung at the girl's funeral, with neither the tune nor the words having been changed from then on as Rev. Black stated, "I played the music just as it is found today in the hymn books, note for note, and I have never dared to change a single word or a note of the song."

PRECIOUS MOMENTS

"Good Morning!", God said, as our eyes opened to embrace the new day. As the sleepy sand is cleared from our eyes we thank God.

We know that our first thoughts should be gratefulness, yet more often than not we busy our minds with what OUR PLAN for the day unfolds.

It took me quite a while to ask God what HE wants and needs and how and who can I bless today.

It's not rocket science to recall the Bible verse that says "with God all things are possible."

Some of us don't think of how awesome that is! Is it not easier to compartmentalize the self-knowledge of our gifts as we know them to be?
